Lance's upcoming presentation is on the Central Valley Steelhead, tactics and locations. Basically a look at the valley rivers steelhead runs on the Yuba, American, Sacramento and the Feather rivers. Seasons, access areas, flies, techniques including standard and double handed rods will all be covered.

Trip Report

American River Steelhead Tour by Derald Lahti



Six Stanislaus Fly Fishers participated in a Lance Gray Steelhead Tour on the American River. We visited the primary walk-in and boat/raft/pontoon launch access spots. This is an incredible urban fishery that hosts a strong Steelhead run. The run begins in October while the river fishes best in January and February. The American River is also a great waterway to find Shad in May and June. After lunch and rigging recommendations, look what happened to Doug (see photo). We were indicator fishing, traditional swinging, and even Spey rod swinging. Our group had a few more grabs before we headed home. The American River is only about 90 minutes from Modesto and offers an excellent, although busy, spot to catch a fish of your lifetime.
