
Membership Information

Rivers of Recovery Auction

As most of you already know, the Stanislaus Fly Fishers has been a supporter of Rivers of Recovery since 2008 when we first formed. Over the years we co-hosted an annual event at The State Theater in Modesto, The Fly Fishing Film Tour, which was our major fundraiser for RoR. Somewhere upwards of \$750,000 was raised over those years to send our combat disabled veterans on weekend-long fly fishing adventures as part of their outdoor recreational therapy.

Unfortunately, when Covid hit, our local fundraising event, along with everything else, came to a screeching halt. Since then we have shifted our efforts to supporting the annual RoR online auction, and it is that time again, To remind you what this effort is all about, here's a refresher on just what RoR offers and means to our veterans:

Rivers of Recovery provides wounded veterans a unique rehabilitative treatment utilizing techniques that are both enjoyable and effective for our participants.

Rivers of Recovery specializes in the rehabilitation of combat veterans suffering with Post Traumatic Stress (PTS), mild Traumatic Brain Injury (mTBI), stress, anxiety and depression.

Our program, which combines outdoor recreational activities with instruction on the self-treatment of symptoms of stress, depression and anxiety, empowers veterans to live a life that is no longer restricted by psychological or physical disabilities. Rivers of Recovery is an enjoyable, cost-effective, medically proven and sustainable treatment, requiring a one-time cost of \$2,500 per veteran (provided free of charge to participants), as compared to two-year maintenance costs between \$5,904-\$32,759 as administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

400,000 to 600,000 Iraq & Afghanistan veterans are estimated to suffer from psychological injuries. Another 320,000 suffer from probable Traumatic Brain Injury.

Our treatment is scientifically-proven and focused on ensuring positive outcomes.

The auction runs from October 22-29, 2022. How can you participate? First, raffle prize donations are currently being accepted. The more raffle prizes that get donated, the more bids that will be made and the more money that will be raised. Info on donating raffle prizes is on the next page.

California is Not Prepared for Drought

California is Not Prepared to Protect the Environment from Drought during the Ongoing Climate Crisis

This past month was a major setback for California's diverse freshwater ecosystems. Drought preparedness bill AB 2451, representing real hope for water scarcity, likely failed, and Governor Newsom introduced a Water Supply Strategy that is an important step but inadequate for the protection of freshwater ecosystems – especially in the face of the ongoing climate crisis.

Here at CalTrout, we balance the needs of fish, water, and people. We recognize that the California we know and love is a functionally altered landscape. Our work and our vision support clean drinking water for all Californians, a thriving economy, while also allowing wild fish to thrive in our rivers, lakes, estuaries, and headwater habitats. However, this balance is not reflected in the Governor's or the State's drought preparedness, vision for the future, or policies.

AB 2451 and Governor Newsom's Water Supply Strategy

Assemblymember Jim Wood sought to address California's lack of drought preparedness in AB 2451. This bill would have created the State of California's only permanent office that prepares for a drier, more arid future. However, because of some short-sighted efforts hidden behind the veil of our legislative process, AB 2451 and California's chance to prepare for long-term drought and aridification have likely failed. While there is some hope that the legislature can support the funding of AB 2451 through a last-minute budget process, it appears more likely that the State Water Resources Control Board and the legislature have once again failed to meet the needs of Californians. *More ...*
