NCCFFI Report to Clubs - October 2022

Update on the progress on the Klamath River - Dam Removal is near!

I've been reporting on and participating in negotiations to remove and restore the Klamath River and its watershed for 20 years. We are now on the verge of actually taking out 4 barrier dams on the river. NCCFFI is pleased that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) released its final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) as part of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review of the Klamath River Renewal project. This is a huge win for the fishery, Tribal Nations, conservation groups and the public in general.

FERC staff recommended approval of the proposed license surrender, decommissioning, and removal of the project with staff modifications and mandatory conditions. The final EIS notes that, "Project removal and implementation of mitigation measures proposed in management plans would protect environmental resources, restore project lands, minimize adverse effects, maximize benefits to protected fish, and restore the landscape of the areas that are currently impounded within the project reach to a more natural state."




Where do we go from here? 1) we need to have the commissioners vote to agree with the state position - typically not a problem. They meet in the 1st week of October, and we expect the final EIR to be released.2) the principles (California, Oregon, pacifiCorp, contractors) to meet & finalize the costs of the project & ensure the money is available. 3) The License needs to be formally transferred to the Klamath River Renewal Corporation & the states of California & Oregon. We expect all of this to be completed before early November, 2022. A few other procedural activities are left for

the winter, 2023, and preparation will begin in Spring of that year to begin preconstruction and ready the dams for decommissioning.

It is impossible for me to convey the sense of satisfaction and relief I feel with where we are today. After many ups and downs, those of us who have been working for this from the start can barely believe this is about to happen!

Let's remember, in 2005 the 4 Tribes involved in partnership with the conservation community, of which NCCFFI was a part, suggested we make the effort to take the dams off the river. It was the federal law that gave this opportunity as it requires that when a dam is relicensed it must be upgraded to current environmental standards. That meant fish passage through or around the 4 lower dams on the Klamath.



This legal requirement started a multi-year process of negotiations with PacifiCorp, the owner of the dams. At first they said "No way are we taking out the dams". We spent 2 years discussing with them that the river could no longer be used to pulse water flows to increase sales of electricity during peak periods. They'd have to operate the river at "run-of-the-river" flows. Then they said the cost of fish passage would not be too high. However, our experts stated it would cost at least \$350 million in 2005 dollars, and likely more.

Once PacifiCorp came around to agreeing they would "talk" about dam removal, it took another 2 years to convince them that their project was not worth \$300 million as they claimed. They were asking those of us who wanted the dams out to pay that claim. In the end, they not only did not receive money for the infrastructure, they put in \$250 million for removal costs. The state of California agreed to add another \$200 million, for \$450 million for removal. That was in the 2010 original agreement we all signed. In 2015, the Klamath Basin Restoration Agreement failed to get through Congress, and it ended. It was a stand-alone from the hydropower agreement. The hydropower agreement was renegotiated and signed in 2015, and it has led to today's final. California, Oregon and PacifiCorp have added an additional \$15 million each in case it is required before completion.

Pre-construction starts in summer 2023, and includes Copco #2 being removed. Full dam removal starts January 2024, with completion of all by October 2023. Hallelujah!
