Wildhorse Reservoir

Member Pat Roe and friend Tom Mills recently spent several days fishing Wildhorse Reservoir an hour north of Elko, NV. According to Pat, a balanced leech was the hot ticket and the bite was good. For once, he produced photographic evidence! According to Pat their color choices





were burgundy/black or black/purplish blue in size 10. Check area reports if/when/where you go for what might work best. They were fishing two-fly rigs in 12'-15' of water with flies about 6'-7' below an indicator. Tom (L) is holding a nice football and Pat's is no minnow either.

The Fly Box - "Midnight Fire Balanced Leech"

Since Pat Roe reported such good results using a balanced leech at Wildhorse Reservoir, and the fact that high water flows will be with us for awhile meaning stillwater fishing will be a good alternative, let's revisit this fly style. Note that while these videos often



refer to specific brands of materials, in many cases you can substitute with something close and the fish won't know the difference. Pat's arsenal of flies is shown on the right, and you can see that the basic designs are the same, but there are a lot of variations in color and style that are possible, including this Midnight Fire Balanced Leech.



Newsom touts \$60-million plan for 'fishway' along Yuba River; critics say it falls short

Citing the need to boost survival rates for imperiled salmon and sturgeon along the heavily dammed Yuba River, state, local and federal officials have announced a \$60-million plan to build a channel that will allow fish to swim easily around a dam that has impeded their passage for more than a century.

Joined by Gov. Gavin Newsom on Tuesday, officials announced that the fishway would bypass the DaGuerre Point Dam, in



Marysville, and allow spring-run chinook salmon, green sturgeon, steelhead, and lamprey to access 10 to 12 miles of spawning habitat upstream. <u>More ...</u>

First Klamath River Dam to be Removed by End of Summer

We are thrilled to share that (de-)construction for removal of the Klamath River dams is well underway. Copco 2, the first of four lower dams slated to be removed, will be removed by the end of September, according to Mark Bransom, CEO of the Klamath River Renewal Corporation.



How will Copco 2 be removed?

In a recent interview with KDRV, Bransom explained that contractors will drill small holes into the large concrete structure of the dam, pack those holes with explosives, and then detonate them. This will enable crews to break up larger pieces of concrete into smaller pieces that are more easily managed by their equipment.

When will the other dams be removed?

By the end of 2024, the remaining three dams — Copco 1, Iron Gate Dam, and J.C. Boyle Dam — will be removed. River restoration activities, led by Resource Environmental Solutions (RES), will continue in the years following dam removal.

Removal of the Klamath River dams will be the world's biggest salmon restoration project. We are thrilled to see this project coming into fruition after years of hard work by so many – most notably by the Tribes and indigenous people that have lived along the river and stewarded it since time immemorial.

The teaching sessions are at the Wente Scout Reservation. There are 7 weekly sessions 6-18 thru 8-3-23. Teaching days are Sunday thru Thursday of each session. Staff tent is provided as well as all your meals. Classes are two hours in the morning and two in the afternoon. Scouting is coed and at times space permitting adults take the instruction.



Wente Scout Reservation is located 140 miles north of Oakland and 6 miles east of Willets The lake is called Winawa and has a healthy population of largemouth bass and bluegill.

Fly Fishing Instructors have full access to the lake after classes and dinner. You can bring your own watercraft or use the rowboats or canoes made available to those who would like to use them.
